A successful native planting project starts with the right plan and continues through establishment.



The site, species, preparation, timing and maintenance all work together. When each stage is managed properly, young natives have a stronger chance of taking hold and becoming a lasting part of the farm.

Restore Native manages the process as one connected job: first paddock walk, mapping, plant supply, site preparation, planting, releasing and follow-up checks.

You are not left juggling separate suppliers, contractors and advice.

One team stays accountable for the whole establishment process.

Our full-service approach brings the key stages of native planting into one clear, practical process.



Site visit and advice

We walk your land, understand your goals and identify the strongest areas for planting — whether that is wet ground, riparian margins, steep faces, erosion-prone areas or unproductive corners.



Planning and mapping

We drone map the site, calculate accurate plant numbers and design the planting layout around your land conditions. Species are selected for the right place, including wetland, dryland, slope and shelter areas.



Co-funding guidance

We help you navigate available co-funding options, understand what is needed to apply and connect with the right providers.



Site preparation and weed control

We set out the preparation work needed before planting, including weed control, pre-spraying and grazing management.



Plant supply and planting

We supply hardy native plants from our nursery and our dedicated planting crew plant them at the right spacing, timing and location for the site.



Releasing and follow-up checks

We support establishment through releasing, progress checks and maintenance advice. Follow-up checks help protect survival and identify whether further releasing or maintenance is needed.



Our experienced team manages the process, so every stage connects properly with the next.

GOOD PLANNING MAKES THE WHOLE PROJECT WORK

Before planting begins, we get clear on the practical details: where plants should go, how many are needed, which species suit the site and what preparation is required.



Planning & Advice

We help you choose suitable planting areas and species, then work out the most practical approach for your land and your goals.

Drone Mapping & Planting Plans

Guesswork has no place in successful planting projects. Accurate mapping gives you a clear picture of the planting area, plant numbers and zone design. It also supports quoting, funding applications and long-term management.

Co-funding Guidance

Co-funding can significantly reduce the cost of a project. We help identify the options that fit your situation, clarify application requirements and connect you with the right providers.*

GETTING PLANTS ESTABLISHED PROPERLY

The work that happens before and during planting has a major impact on survival. We prepare the site, match plants to the right conditions and plant at the right spacing so young natives have the best chance to establish.

Site Preparation & Weed Control

Good site preparation reduces weed and grass pressure before plants go in. We recommend the right mix of grazing management, weed control and targeted pre-spraying for the site.

Pre-Spraying

Timing matters. Pre-spraying is planned so young native plants have space, light and moisture available from day one.

Plant supply from our nursery

We grow hardy native plants suited to farm restoration conditions. Species are matched to your site, including wetland areas, riparian margins, dry slopes, shelter belts and mixed native zones.

On-Farm Planting

Our experienced crew plants on site in the right layout, density and timing for the conditions, creating a practical planting that is easier to establish and maintain.

Maintenance is where success is protected

Planting day is only one part of the job. The months after planting are critical, especially while young plants are competing with grass and weeds.

Releasing

Releasing helps stop grass and weeds from overtaking young plants, protecting survival through the early establishment period.

Monitoring & Follow-Up Checks

We check how the planting is tracking and advise whether further releasing or maintenance is needed. This helps keep the project on course and protects the investment already made.

Accountability through establishment

Because Restore Native manages the process from start to finish, we stay focused on the result — not just the planting day.

Our aim is to help your planting establish strongly and become a native area you can be proud of.
